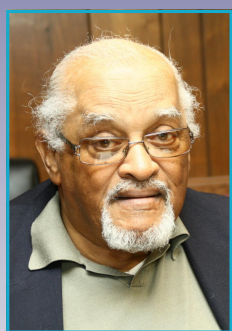


Why Should We Have Healthcare Reform?
